The school year started off with the whole school visiting the Time and Tide Museum in Yarmouth.

Financial education is enhancing our "Learning for Life" mission statement; Tivetshall, along with our partnership school, Burston, is well on its way to achieving a pfeg (personal finance and education group) 'Centre of Excellence' award.

Christmas events followed the usual format with a Christingle service in the church and a concert in the school hall. We also took part in the final 50 trees event in Dickleburgh church; children designed and created the tree decorations.

The new year started with Diversity Week when the children and staff celebrated difference.

The annual Mothers' Day Cafe raised a substantial amount for cooking Easter Garden and Flower arranging competitions produced some wonderful, creative displays by the pupils.

A residential for the older pupils was very successful and helped children improve their social skills and independence. We would like to thank the Friends of Tivetshall School and local charities who, through their generosity, enabled every child to attend.

The Governors recently approved a lower admission age which allows us, for the first time, to offer nursery provision five mornings a week for rising fours. School care vouchers can be used to fund this.

We feel this is an important step in ensuring that we continue to keep the school viable.
